

## **2020 Fremont County Fair Schedule**

**(Attendance limits are based on current guidelines and venue space limitations.  
If for some reason guidance changes, virtual option will be reassessed.)**

### **Fair Requirements:**

- **4-H/FFA Fair Only, No Open Fair**
- **No events for the public (No Family Day, Senior Day, Rodeo etc.)**
- **Fair Grounds Closed to Public**
- **Not Open to the Public for Any Shows**
- **Buildings Not Open to Public**
- **Gathering Limits will be based on space for each event and limits set by local public health.**
- **All attendees will be required to pre-register for shows to maintain gathering and space limit. Check in is required before entering grounds or range.**
- **Schedule is Subject to Change**
- **All Attendees, Participants, Volunteers must wear face coverings.**
- **All animals must be taken home after shows.**
- **Shows are blow and go. Constants should clip and wash animals at home. No fitting at the show. No adhesives or paint allowed. If you use adhesives, you will be sent to the wash rack to hose off the animal. Fair Board and Judge will make determinations on disqualifications or lowered placings for not following the rules.**
- **Animals should be brought CLEAN. Wash racks will be available for rinsing or cooling animals off, but only 2 racks will be open so space will be limited.**
- **Awards will be given out at the Achievement Night instead of after the show. Photos should be taken at the photo area after the show. These photos will be used for the show bill and online bidding that will be shared with buyers.**
- **Pens can be used. There is a \$20 deposit fee. Pens must be cleaned out after use. 4-H'ers must sign out with Grant to receive their deposit back.**

### **Health Precaution Requirements:**

- **Face coverings will be required at all times.**
- **Bathrooms will be cleaned every 2 hours.**
- **Hand Sanitizer stations will be available at entrances, exits, stands, drink/food locations, etc.**
- **Stands and high touch surfaces will be cleaned/sanitized between shows.**
- **Physical Distancing will be required at all times. Seats will be assigned in stands.**

- **Only pre-packaged food/drinks will be sold. Limited meal options will be available.**

### **Saturday, July 18**

**Shooting Sports Competition Muzzle Range – (7 exhibitors, 14 audience, 15 staff) 2 family members only per shooter may attend. Please only watch from the line when your shooter is shooting.**

**8:30 a.m.** Check in for the 4-H Muzzleloading begins at the Royal Gorge Gun Club.

**9:00 a.m.** The 4-H Muzzleloading Competition will begin.

**Shooting Sports Competition Archery Range – (21 exhibitors, 42 audience, 10 staff) Only 2 family members per shooter may attend. Lawn Chairs must be physically distanced at least 8-10 ft from other family groups. Please only watch from the line when your shooter is shooting. Will be scheduled as normal.**

**8:30 a.m.** Check in for the 4-H Archery will begin at Royal Gorge Gun Club.

**9:30 a.m.** The 4-H Archery Competition will begin.

### **Sunday, July 19**

**Shooting Sports .22 Competition - (18 exhibitors, 36 audience, 15 staff) Only 2 family members per shooter may attend. Lawn Chairs must be physically distanced at least 8-10 ft from other family groups. Please only watch from the line when your shooter is shooting while physically distancing from other families. Will run on two ranges. (4/5 on muzzle range and 7-9 on .22 range).**

**7:30 a.m.** Check in for the 4-H.22 Rifle will be at the Royal Gorge Gun Club.

**8:30 a.m.** The 4-H.22 Rifle Competition will begin.

### **Tuesday, July 21**

**5:00 p.m.** State Fair & Shirt Fees are due in the Extension Office.

### **Friday, July 24**

**Dog Show - (14 exhibitors, Estimated Total 47) Only 4 family members only may attend. Families will need to bring lawn chairs and must maintain the 8 – 10 ft. physical distancing between families.**

**8:00 a.m.** Check in for Dog Show begins.

**9:00 a.m.** 4-H Dog Show begins at Pathfinder Park.

## **Saturday, July 25**

**8:00am – Noon** Fairgrounds/Barn Set Up. **Volunteers Needed.**

**Horse Show - (6 exhibitors, 24 audience, 15 staff)**

**Member and 4 family members may be at Pathfinder Park during judging. Families must maintain the 6 ft. physical distancing and must follow all fair requirements.**

**7:30 a.m.** Check in and Vet Check will begin at Pathfinder Park.

**8:30 a.m.** Check in will close for the 4-H Horse Show.

**9:00 a.m.** 4-H Horse show at Pathfinder Park will start with 4-H English Showmanship. The 4-H English Performance Class will follow Showmanship. 4-H Western Performance Class will follow the English competitions. The riding portion of the 4-H Royalty Contest will begin upon completion of the Western riding competitions. The last event will be the 4-H Horse Gymkhana Events. All horse show awards will be given upon completion of all events for the day.

**12:00 p.m.** Set up Judging Tables at 4-H Building.

**1:00 p.m. General Project Check In (112 families, 20 min drop off time slots would be assigned)** Start the 4-H/FFA General Project, Consumer Science, Cloverbuds drop off project for judging. The building is not open and you must come at your scheduled drop off time.

**5:00 p.m.** 4-H Building closes.

## **Sunday, July 26**

**1:00 p.m. General Project Check In (112 families, 20 min drop off time slots would be assigned)** Start the 4-H/FFA General Project, Consumer Science, Cloverbuds drop off project for judging. The building is not open and you must come at your scheduled drop off time.

**5:00 p.m.** 4-H Building closes.

## **Monday, July 27**

**9:00 a.m.** 4-H/FFA judging begins for all 4-H/FFA General projects to include at 4-H Building. Depending on entries, judging might need to be scheduled to prevent too many people in the building. There will not be any interview judging for general projects this year.

**8:00am – 3:00pm**

**All Animals (Sheep, Goat, Swine, Beef) Weigh In, Vet Check, and Ultra Sound**  
Families will sign up for a time slot. Time Slots will be 15 minutes. Families will need to remain in their vehicle until the family ahead of them pulls out.

**Tuesday, July 28 - Poultry Show (17 exhibitors, 47 estimated total)**

**Member and 1 of their immediate family members (mom, dad, siblings) may be in the building during judging. Other immediate family members can help with check in. Families must maintain the 6 ft. physical distancing from other families and must follow all fair requirements. Families should bring lawn chairs for outside seating while waiting.**

**7:00 a.m.** Check-in for 4-H/FFA Poultry will begin in the Small Animal Barn. Please come during your scheduled check in time slot.

**9:00 a.m.** Check-in for 4-H/FFA Poultry will close.

**10:00 a.m.** Poultry judging starts in Small Animal Barn. Poultry Showmanship will follow. **There will be time slots for Showmanship to ensure physical distancing. Pictures will be taken following the showmanship show.**

**Royalty Contest - 4-H Building- Member and their immediate family members (mom, dad, siblings) may be in the building during judging. Families must maintain the 6 ft. physical distancing and must follow all fair requirements.**

**10:00 a.m.** 2021 4-H Royalty interviews and modeling contests will be held in 4-H Building. 2021 4-H/FFA Royalty will be announced following the interview and modeling contests.

**Dairy and Sheep Shows – (6 Dairy/Sheep Exhibitors, 24 audience, 20 staff) Estimated Total) Dairy Cow (4 exhibitors), Dairy Goat (1 exhibitor), Sheep (3 exhibitors) Only 4 family members per contestant may be at the Fairgrounds during judging. Families must maintain the 6 ft. physical distancing and must follow all fair requirements.**

**4:00 p.m.** Check-in for 4-H/FFA Dairy and Sheep Show begins at Fairgrounds.

**5:00 p.m.** 4-H/FFA Dairy Goat judging will begin in the Show Ring. 4-H/FFA Dairy Cattle judging will follow. Pictures immediately following the show.

**6:00 p.m.** 4-H/FFA Sheep Showmanship will start in the Show Ring. The 4-H/FFA Breeding Sheep and Market Sheep shows will follow. Pictures immediately following the show.

**Wednesday, July 29 Only 4 family members per contestant may attend.**

**Goat Show Breeding and Market (19 exhibitors, 76 audience, 20 staff)**

**8:00 a.m.** Check-in for 4-H/FFA Goat Shows begins at the Fairgrounds.

**9:30 a.m.** 4-H/FFA Goat Showmanship judging will begin in the Show Ring. Market Goat and Breeding Goat classes will follow. Pictures immediately following the show.

**Companion Rabbit and Pocket Pets will only turn in boards at the 4-H Building during General Project Drop Off on Monday. Animals will not be brought in or stay at the 4-H Building.**

**Cat Show at the 4-H Building - (3 exhibitors total, 12 audience, 10 staff) Member and 4 family members may be in the building during judging. Families must maintain the 6 ft. physical distancing and must follow all fair requirements.**  
**1:00 p.m.** Check in for Cats  
**1:30 p.m.** Cat Show begins at the Fair Grounds.

**Thursday, July 30 – Swine Show (25 exhibitors, 72 audience, 20 staff)**  
**Only 4 family members per contestant FAMILY may attend. Contestants will show in smaller groups to maintain physical distancing.**  
**6:30 a.m.** Check-in for 4-H/FFA Swine Show begins at Fairgrounds.  
**9:30 a.m.** 4-H/FFA Swine Showmanship judging will begin. Market Swine class will follow. Pictures immediately following the show.

**2:00 p.m. – 5:00pm** 4-H/FFA Project pick up for General projects at the 4-H Building. Members will have to come at their scheduled time to pick up their projects, 10 minute time slots.

**Friday, July 31**  
**VIRTUAL Rabbit Show - (21 exhibitors) Rabbit Show will be virtual due to RHD. More info will be sent out on picture and video submission requirements.**

**Beef Show - Breeding Beef (5 exhibitors), Market Beef (11 exhibitors) Only 4 family members per contestant may attend.**  
**7:00 a.m.** Check-in for Market Beef at the Fair Grounds.  
**9:00 a.m.** 4-H/FFA Breeding Beef Show will begin in the Show Ring. Market Beef judging will begin 30 minutes from the completion of the Breeding Beef judging. Beef Showmanship will follow the Market Beef Show. Pictures immediately following the show.

**2:00 p.m. – 5:00pm** 4-H/FFA Project pick up for General projects at the 4-H Building. Members will have to come at their scheduled time to pick up their projects, 10 minute time slots. Building Clean Up when pick up is over.

**Saturday, August 1** – (250 max audience, 170 anticipated audience, 35 staff/volunteers, 120-140 “performers” (members selling plus parents). Only 1 parent per member allowed at the sale. For families with only 1 youth selling, 2 parents are allowed.

Sale will be live at Pathfinder. Sale Bill and Fair Entry Online Bidding will be sent out Friday evening. Those not comfortable attending in person can bid online through Fair Entry or call in a bid from 10am – 2pm on Saturday to livestock sale committee members. Any online or phone bids will be the starting bid for the live auction.

Butchering will be the responsibility of the buyer. Buyback will be available for beef, swine, sheep and goats. For poultry buyers, butchering is the responsibility of the buyer. Upon buying, declare if you will take the birds or send them home with the 4-H/FFA member. Rabbits will be a project only sale due to RHD. Members will show poster with photo of meat pen.

Stands will be for Buyers Only with assigned seating. 4-H/FFA members/families cannot intermingle with buyers and must remain on the arena side of the grounds and leave once their animal is sold.

**7:00 a.m.** Sale Set Up at Pathfinder Park. **LOTS OF VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!** Please call the Extension office to sign up to help with setup, during sale, or clean up.

**5:00 p.m.** 4-H/FFA members begin lining up for sale. Directions will be given on arrival times and line up.

**6:00 p.m.** The 4-H/FFA Market Livestock Sale begins at Pathfinder Park.

**Saturday, August 8th**

Shooting Sports Shotgun Competition – (7 exhibitors, 42 audience, 10 staff) Only 6 family members per contestant may attend. Lawn Chairs must be physically distanced at least 8 -10ft from other family groups. Cactus Flats will provide hamburger/hot dog lunch with prepackaged sides.

**8:30 a.m.** Check in for the 4-H Trap at the Cactus Flats Gun Club.

**9:00 a.m.** The 4-H Trap Competition will begin. Skeet will follow Trap Competition.

**Shooting Sports Air Rifle Competition 4-H Building – (11 exhibitors, 22 audience, 12 staff) 2 family members per shooter may be in the building during shooting time. All other participants and attendees must wait outside in cars or lawn chairs until their shooting time slot. Those waiting must be physically distanced at least 6 ft from other family groups. You must provide your own lawn chairs outside, 4-H Building chairs will not be available for public use.**

**1:30 p.m.** Check in for the 4-H Air Rifle at the 4-H/FFA Building.

**2:00 p.m.** The 4-H Air Rifle Competition will begin.

**Sunday, August 9<sup>th</sup>**

**Shooting Sports Shotgun Competition - (7 exhibitors, 42 audience, 10 staff) Only 6 family members per contestant may attend. Lawn Chairs must be physically distanced at least 8-10ft from other family groups. Cactus Flats will provide hamburger/hot dog lunch with prepackaged sides.**

**8:30 a.m.** Check in for the 4-H Sporting Clays begins at the Cactus Flats Gun Club.

**9:00 a.m.** The 4-H Sporting Clays Competition will begin.
