Forty-six competitors took part in the Shooting Sports Competition at county fair. The competition lasted four days and included 6 disciplines—shotgun, air rifle, air pistol, .22 rifle, muzzle loading, and archery. Practices began in April and were held weekly with our certified coaches. Members could compete in any number of disciplines as long they attended at least four practices and a safety meeting for that discipline.






