### SUPREME CHAMPIONS Market Beef, Goat, Sheep and Swine

The Supreme Champion in each division is awarded to the 4-H member and NOT to an animal. All animals a 4-Her has are automatically entered in the Supreme contest and all points earned in Showmanship, Written Test, and Record Book are given to each animal. Each animal then earns individual points for Live Placing and Carcass/Ultrasound Contest. If a 4-Her has more than one animal in a species the animal with the highest score is the supreme score for the 4-Her. If you have questions regarding the Supreme Champions please contact the Extension Office.

Livestock Record Book Judging Volunteers Needed 8/25! – Animal and Livestock Record Book Judging will take place on Saturday, August 25th at the 4-H Building 8am – Noon. Each club is requested to send at least 2 adults (leaders or parents) to help. Remember, if a club is not represented by at least one adult to help judge, that club's record books will not be eligible for record book awards. We encourage sending more than 2 if you can, the more people we have to help the faster it goes! Call the office to sign up.

## PROMOTE YOURSELF AND YOUR MARKET ANIMAL



You have worked hard to produce a finished marketable animal; you deserve a great return. Now it is time for you to put effort into marketing yourself and your animal to see that great return.

The Sale Committee and the Extension Office do their best to assist, but YOU are who the buyers are watching. Avoid negativity--do not ask the buyer to bid on only your animal or for a specific amount.

- Pass out flyers to businesses with information about the Sale
- Inspire the public to want to give back through community service and excellent character
- Remember when interacting with people that everyone is a potential buyer
- Invite buyers to the sale through in-person meetings and/or personal written invitations
- Show gratitude and appreciation

## **Requirements to Show and/or Sell at the Fremont County Fair**

The amount of planning and paper work that has to be done to organize the county fair is tremendous and each exhibitor has certain responsibilities to help make sure that things get done properly.

The Fair Board wants to make sure everyone knows that a 4-H member must meet the following requirements to be allowed to show at the County Fair:

- Must be enrolled in Fremont County 4-H by the appropriate deadline and be a member in good standing.
- Must be enrolled in the project by the appropriate deadline.
- Must attend at least 50% of the regularly scheduled club meetings from the date they enroll.
- Must take the Meat Quality Assurance class at the proper ages.
- Must take the appropriate written tests for horse and market projects by the deadline.
- Must turn in a COMPLETED entry form (must include ear tag numbers, sex, age, birth dates, tattoos, breed, variety, class numbers, etc. where appropriate) by the deadline.
- Must have a valid Colorado Identification Number for the location where the Market Animal was housed.
- Must participate in appropriate showmanship class for the specie.

If any of these eight (8) requirements is not met, the 4-H member will NOT be allowed to show at the Fremont County Fair. The Fair Board also wants to make sure everyone knows that a 4-H member must meet the following requirements to be allowed to sell at the County Fair:

- Must participate in Showmanship.
- Must exhibit their animal and qualify through the proper species show.

- Must have a picture made (4-H members must be appropriately dressed) for the buyer immediately after the species show.
- Must fill out and turn in a completed "Sale Order Card" immediately after the last market show that the 4-H member has an entry in.

If any of these three (3) requirements is not met, the 4-H member will NOT be allowed to sell at the Fremont County Fair.

## Pen fee

The Fremont County Fair Board charges a \$20.00 per pen fee, payable at check-in for all Beef, Sheep, Goats, Swine and Dairy projects. The fee will be refunded once the member has cleaned the pen and checked out. Members will be required to care for their animals and pens as usual during the fair. Animals must be left with food and fresh water after the livestock sale. Pen check-out must be done by the animal Superintendent or the designee. Questions regarding this policy may be directed to members of the Fremont County Fair Board.

# Livestock check-in requirements

ALL proper brand inspection paperwork and USDA Wholesome Meat Act Form must be submitted at the gate at check-in on July 26th. This includes ALL animals which will go through the sale, animals sold by private treaty and animals sold as buyback to Fremont County Fair Livestock Sale Committee for floor price.

## Weight Requirements: Page 121

<u>Beef:</u> Market Beef must weigh a minimum of 1,000 lbs. Market Beef may not weight over 1,450 lbs.

<u>Sheep</u>: Market Sheep must weigh a minimum of 100 lbs. There is no maximum weight, however, sheep must have milk teeth.

<u>Swine</u>: Swine must weight a minimum of 240 lbs. and a maximum weight of 300 lbs.

<u>Goat</u>: Market Goats must weigh a minimum of 50 lbs. and a maximum of 110 lbs.

## Show Attire: Page 111

1. Market Beef, Sheep, Swine, and Goats – Long or short sleeved button shirt or blouse, clean dark colored jeans or slacks. Hard soled closed-toed shoes or boots for safety. No hats or caps.


2. Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goats – White shirts and pants.

3. Horse – Western - boots, belt and long-sleeved button or snap shirt with collar. Optional: Gloves, ties, chaps, vests, jackets, breast collar and spurs. English – jacket, breeches or jodhpurs and appropriate boots. All riders must wear protective headgear.

4. Rabbits & Chickens – Jeans or slacks and long-sleeved shirts are preferred for safety.

Include your name, age and location (city/state). And any other information you would like for me to know. Just tell me about yourself and what showing rabbits means to you. For the essay include your knowledge level with rabbits, have you shown, bred, owned rabbits

Do you plan to show him at any of the ARBA shows or just the county show?

If you already own rabbits, tell us about your daily care and maintenance of your barn and herd. If you don't own rabbits but own other animals, tell us about your care and maintenance of them.





# Adults:

### COLORADO 4-H CODE OF CONDUCT

4-H members, leaders, parents, and other adults participating in 4-H programs will:

Note: A Signed Code of Conduct is located in <u>4-H Online</u>, under profile information section.

1. Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.

2. Conduct themselves in a courteous, respectful manner, use appropriate language, exhibit good sportsmanship, and act as positive role models.

3. Abstain from illegal behaviors, use of alcohol, marijuana, illegal or illicit drugs, and tobacco including e-cigarettes and vaping device during 4-H events and activities.

- 4. Fully participate in scheduled activities.
- 5. Respect other's property and privacy rights.
- 6. Respect the rights and authority of parents, leaders and Extension Agents.
- 7. Abstain from abuse (physical and/or verbal) and harassment.
- 8. Accept personal responsibility for behavior including any financial damage.
- 9. Be responsible for any financial damage caused by inappropriate behavior.
- 10. Adhere to principles and rules of safety.

Consequences for violating any part of this code of conduct may include, but are not limited to: removal from participation in the event in which the code of conduct has been violated *at the individual's expense*; sanctions on participating in future 4-H events; forfeiture of financial support for the event; removal from offices held, etc.

Behavior outside of 4-H activities can affect member in good standing or volunteer in good standing status.

It is the responsibility of all program participants to reinforce the code of conduct and to report any violations or concerns to 4-H leadership.
