




















To all of the Fair Board Members, Club Leaders, Project Leaders, Superintendents, Parents, siblings, and all other volunteers

2023 Fair Lickoff


The Fremont County Fair kicked off with two new exciting changes! The ribbon cutting and family of the year announcements were done before the start of the Junior rodeo!



A letter from the leaders, Martin and MaryEllen:

Champs or Bust 4-H Club has just completed its 71st year of continuous operations led by Martin's grandparents, his parents Paul and Lois Telck and now Martin and MaryEllen Telck. The club has been a staple in the Fremont County program and has guided an unknown number of 4-H members through the program. The club has had a wonderful 2022-2023 year, and we are proud of all club members. Memories were made, and fun was had.

After almost 20 years of being part of this wonderful program as parents, club leaders and Shooting Sport coaches, and after substantial discussion and consideration, we have decided to close the Champs or Bust 4-H Club effective the end of the 2023 4-H year.
