4-H Livestock Updates

COLORADO STATE FAIR MARKET BEEF

All Market Beef animals must be identified in the program by the junior exhibitor only. It is MANDATORY for each Market Beef to carry a county tag to be eligible for entry at the Colorado State Fair. The ONLY way to get a county tag is to bring the animal to the Fremont County Market Beef Weigh Day. At this time, they will be tagged and weighed.

Office fee - There will be a processing fee of \$5.00 per animal nominated for the Colorado State Fair. Payment will be required at time of weigh-in. Checks are to be made out to Fremont County Extension Fund. This is a Fremont County office fee and is not a charge by the Colorado State Fair.

Show eligibility for the Colorado State Fair requires an official brand inspection issued in the sole name of the Colorado 4-H or FFA exhibitor. No family names will be accepted. Make sure the individual name is the same on the weigh-in lists, nomination card and brand inspection. The Colorado State Fair will continue to require either a Premise ID or Location # and this number MUST be on the nomination card.

All Market Beef nominated for the CSF are required to submit DINA information through the State Fair website. All nomination cards MUST be signed by the 4-H/Ag agent if the project is through 4-H. All nomination cards must be sent in by the agent. No nomination will be accepted if mailed in by the exhibitor. They MUST be present to sign the nomination card(s). If you have questions contact Shanan Davey.

Additional Requirements (ALL Animal Projects) Premise ID and Animal Care & Housing Forms must be completed and turned into the Extension Office. Weigh-in is NOT OPTIONAL. It is a mandatory requirement from the Fremont County Fair Board. Your animal must be weighed in and tagged on the day specified (Beef Feb. 4th, Sheep & Goats May 13th).

We will be looking into the history of the fair, 4-H Clubs, FFA, etc. 100 years is a lot to cover so the Committee will need your help.


We will be asking each club to display information about their club history. It's not too early to start doing research. More information to come.

SERVSAFE FOOD PROTECTION MANAGER TRAINING

What is ServSafe?

ServSafe is a comprehensive course on food safety that is administered by the National Restaurant Association.

Who should attend?

Managers of retail food establishments who are not currently certified as Food Protection Managers.

Why attend?

The updated Colorado Food Code requires all retail food establishments to have a Certified Food Protection Manager on hand and exerting active managerial control at all times. ServSafe participants who score 75% or above on the exam obtain this required certification as Food Protection Managers.

How much does it cost?

A full-day workshop costs \$125/person, which includes 7 hours of training, a ServSafe textbook, and a proctored exam. Other training options are available upon request.

Project meetings may happen once a year, a few times a year, once a month, twice a month, or weekly. This varies by volunteer availability, project content, and other factors. If you need assistance figuring out your projects, we encourage you to call the office.
