



LIVESTOCK UPDATES

COLORADO STATE FAIR MARKET ANIMALS

All Market animals must be identified in the program by the junior exhibitor only. It is MANDATORY for each Market Animal to carry a county tag to be eligible for entry at the Colorado State Fair. The ONLY way to get a county tag is to bring the animal to the Fremont County weigh day designated to that animal. They will receive tags once weighed in.

Show eligibility for the Colorado State Fair requires an official brand inspection issued in the sole name of the Colorado 4-H or FFA exhibitor. No family names will be accepted. Make sure the individual name is the same on the weigh-in lists, nomination card and brand inspection. The Colorado State Fair will continue to require either a Premise ID or Location # and this number MUST be on the nomination card. All Market Animals nominated for the CSF are required to submit DNA information through the State Fair website. All nomination cards MUST be signed by the 4-H/Ag agent if the project is through 4-H. All nomination cards must be sent in by the agent. No nomination will be accepted if mailed in by the exhibitor. They MUST be present to sign the nomination card(s). 
CSF NOMINATION DEADLINES

March 4th, 2024– DNA Packets available April 1st, 2024 – Beef DNA postmarked and sent to CSF June 1st, 2024 – Goat, Lamb, and Hog DNA postmarked and sent to CSF July 29th, 2024 – Entry Forms Due Online for CSF. Mailed entries are not accepted. These must be completed online. Weigh in is NOT-Optional! It is a mandatory requirement from the Fremont County Fair Board. Your animal must be weighed in and tagged on the specified day

Colorado Location ID (LID) Requirements for 4-H/FFA Animals The Fremont County Fair Board REQUIRES all Livestock, Goats, Sheep, Swine, Cattle, Poultry, Rabbits, and Horses to have either a valid Premises ID # or Location ID # to ENTER the Fremont County Fair. FAIR LIVESTOCK RULE UPDATES

1.Market tests will be in person and closed-book at the extension office this year. No online tests will be provided. The test times are June 5th from 8 am- 10 am and June 6th from 6-8 pm at Pathfinder Park . If a 70% score on the written test is not attained, a make up test date is scheduled for June 27th. Study will be available May 1st.

2. Showmanship for Goat, Sheep and Swine will now be after the Market Show instead of Showmanship before Market Show.

3.All Market goats must be shown with a collar, chain or an approved show halter. (Pronged collars will not be allowed)

4.Drenching for hydration purposes will be allowed for market goats and sheep, NO stomach pumping devices will be allowed.

5. Weight changes

- Market Swine
 - Minimum weight of 230 lbs and maximum weight of 300 lbs
- Market Goat
 - Minimum weight of 50 lbs and maximum weight of 120 lbs

6.Previous Fremont County Fair Master Showmen Champion may compete again in the same species they won with in the previous year. It is not required they win with a different species to continue showing in master showmanship. Example: If last year the Master Showman qualified through the beef division, he/she may qualify again in the beef division and compete again.




HUNTERS SAFETY CLASS FOR 4-H'ERS
